UNIDADE ESCOLAR:

Must/Have to, Mustn't/Don't have to

MUST

Usage

- Express personal obligation
- Express what the speaker thinks is necessary
- Express subjective obligation



- · You must work hard.
- All passengers must wear seat belts.

HAVE TO

Usage

- Express impersonal obligation
- The subject is obliged or forced to act by a separate, external power (for example, the Law or school rules)
- Express objective obligation

Examples

- I have to leave early today.
- You will have to pay for the excess.

MUSTN'T

<u>Usage</u>

• It is prohibited; it is not allowed. It is important that you do NOT do something. The prohibition can be subjective (the speaker's opinion) or objective.

Examples

- Children mustn't talk to strangers.
- Cars mustn't park in front of the entrance.

DON'T HAVE TO

<u>Usage</u>

 There is no obligation; you are not required to do something, especially if you don't want to.

Examples

- You don't have to make excuses for her.
- You don't have to whisper, no one can hear us.
